Project Health Promoting Sports Clubs (PROSCeSS)

To achieve the objectives of the PROSCeSS project, the team recruit a post-doctoral researcher in public health and/or social or psychological sciences applied to sport. This is a full time employment for 12 months (renewable for 12 months) starting the 1st September 2022.

Context

The Health Promoting Sports Clubs (PROSCeSS) project is a partnership between Santé publique France (French Public Health agency), Université Côte d'Azur and Université de Lorraine, in collaboration with the Ministry in charge of sports. The first part of the project (2018-2021) has led to the co-construction of a theoretical grounded intervention. The second phase (2022-2023) seek to implement and evaluate this intervention, including a massive open online course (MOOC) and an empowering sports clubs' program. The recruited post-doctoral researcher will be in charge of the data collection and analysis of data linked to intervention implementation (effectiveness and implementation process evaluation), including quantitative and qualitative data. He/she will play a role in the dissemination process of the project, by running working group with French sports federation and sports clubs stakeholders.

- 1) Collect and analyse the data of an experimental study including 15 sports clubs
- 2) Contribute to data analysis of the MOOC PROSCeSS

- 4) Running a national network on sports clubs stakeholders on PROSCeSS project
- 5) Take part to the scientific and applied dissemination of the project
